Tree types: solitary shrubs

USE

Location: park, central reservation, in containers, large garden, small garden, traffic areas, industrial zones | **Pavement:** none | **Planting concepts:** Prairie planting

CHARACTERISTICS

Crown shape: vase-shaped | **Crown structure:** dense | **Height:** 2 - 4 m | **Width:** 2 - 4 m | **Winter hardiness zone:** 6A - 9B

ASPECTS

Wind: tolerant to wind | **Soil:** sabulous clay, light clay, sand, loamy soil | **Nutrient level:** rich in nutrients | **Soil moisture level:** dry, moist | **Light requirements:** sun, partial shade | **pH range:** neutral, alkaline | **Host plant/forage plant:** bees, birds, nectar value 0, pollen value 3 | **Extreme environments:** tolerant to dryness, tolerates air pollution

PLANTKENMERKEN

Flowers: discrete, small | **Flower colour:** pale orange | **Flowering period:** March - April | **Leaf colour:** buds yellow, yellow-green | **Leaves:** evergreen, needles or scales, short needles | **Fruits:** toxic, small, berry | **Fruit colour:** red | **Bark colour:** red-brown | **Bark:** furrowed | **Twig colour:** yellow | **Twigs:** bare
